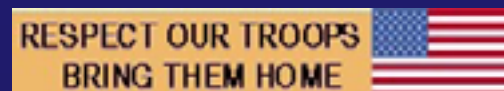
Because she wanted a good upbringing for her children, Judy became president of Parent's Co-op Nursery School, and later helped found Ellen Thacher Children's Center

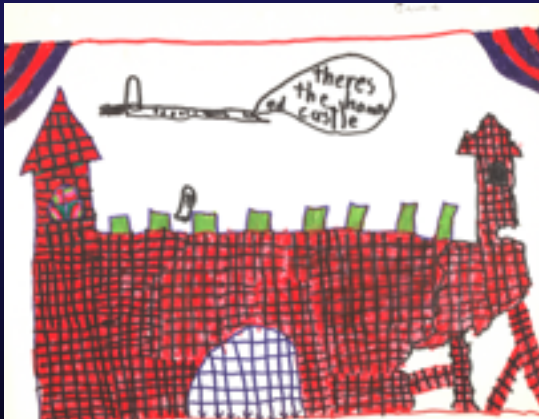

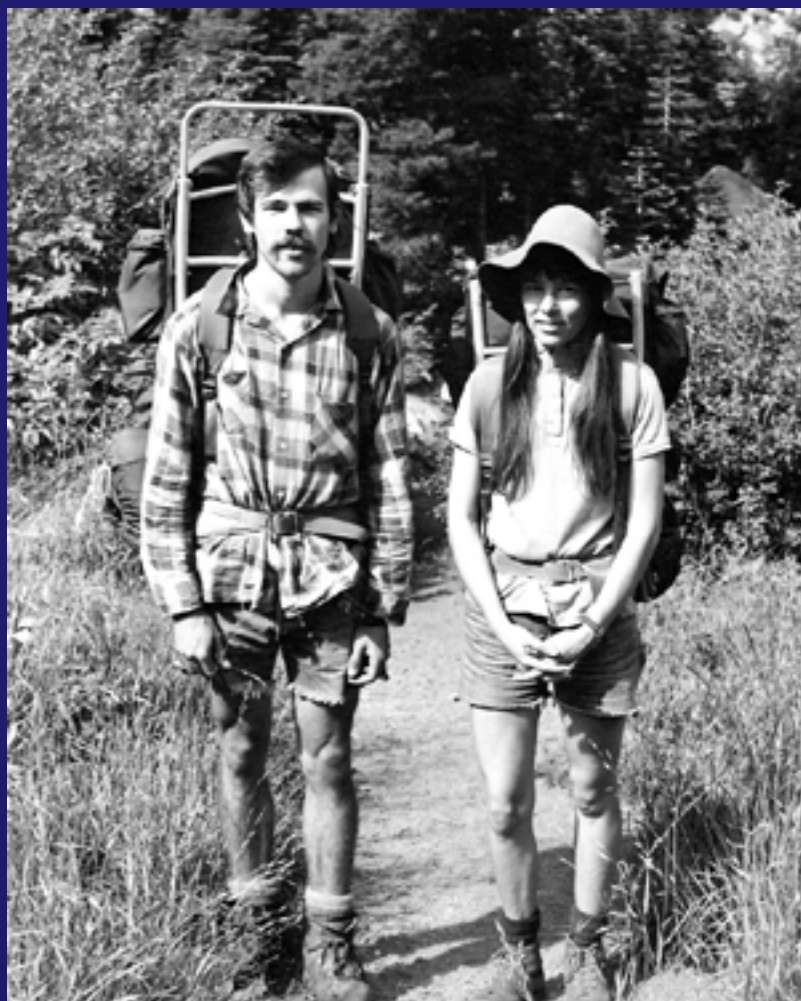

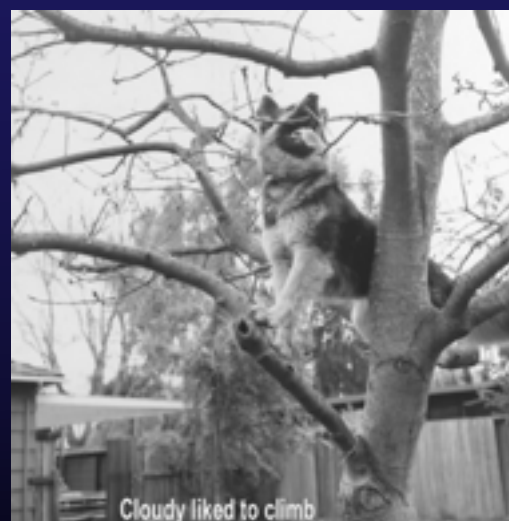

## Judy becomes an author

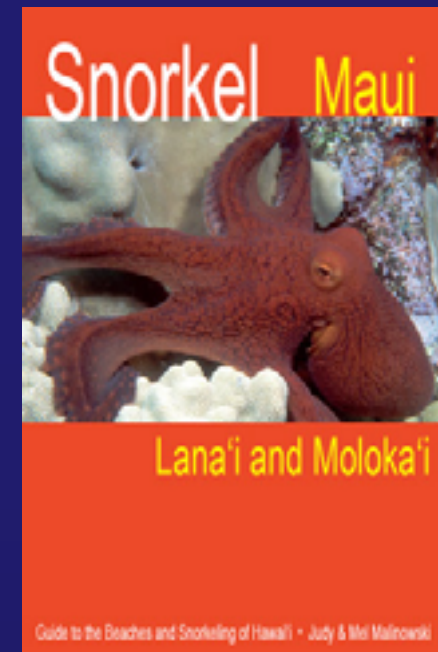
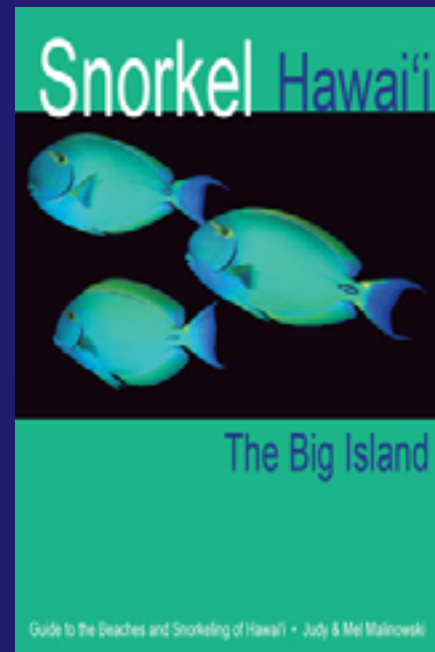
Our first family trip to a tropical ocean was in 1980, to the island of Saint Lucia in the Caribbean.

The problem was that all the guide-books had inadequate information about where to snorkel. You'd read about a place, go there, and walk away wondering if they actually got in the ocean!

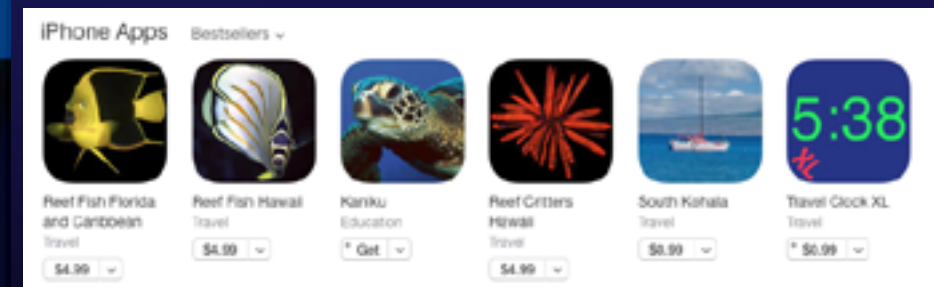
One day Judy said "Why don't we write a good guidebook to all the snorkel sites?" No one had done this. And so we did.

When the Big Island book became popular, we wrote two more, and they are regarded as the authoritative guides for snorkeling in Hawai'i



Judy now had three more offspring.

Becoming publishers led us to explore more of the world, and drew us to some far-flung destinations and exotic adventures. Later, we also created apps for Apple iPhones and iPads

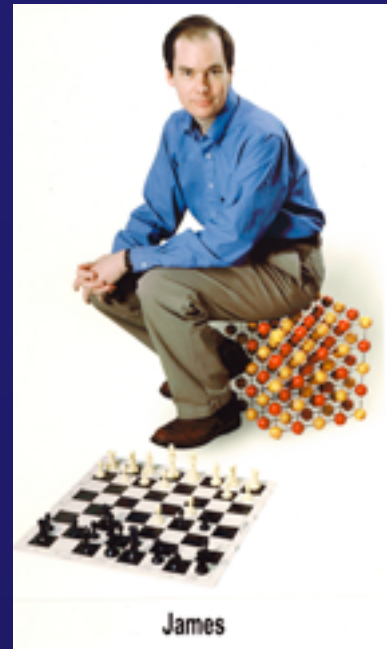

Judy developed a lung malady called 'bronchiectasis', probably due to a measles episode in childhood in the days before inoculations.

She eventually had to have supplemental oxygen to fly, but was able to go up to the 9,000 foot elevation Mauna Kea visitor's center using her nifty portable oxygen concentrator.





In 2014, Judy began losing weight, and in 2015 was diagnosed as having advanced leukemia.

She bravely underwent chemotherapy to try to stop the cancer.

Here she was fitted with a 'picc' line into her heart to channel the chemo drug for seven days.

She could always come up with a smile and a laugh.



Though Judy had lost her sister Gail to pulmonary fibrosis, she kept a positive attitude, and most people who visited her commented that 'she looks great!'

She would say later "Wish I felt great!"

A doctor once told her that she was "the best looking seriously ill patient I've ever had!"

Like her father Don, she was handsome till the day she died.
